The purpose of the Interactive Engineering Notebook is to enable you to be a creative and independent thinker, processor and writer. Notebooks will have a "right side, left side" orientation to help you record, organize and process new information. Class work and homework will be completed almost entirely in your notebook. Notebooks will be organized in the following way:

Left Side <i>Students Process New Ideas</i>	Right Side <i>Teacher Provides New Information</i>
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Review previous information and preview new information Express opinions and feelings Explore new ideas Reorganize new information in creative formats Process class work/homework 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Class notes/projects/sketches Discussion and reading notes Handouts with new information Student research from teacher provided materials

Notebooks will be graded every 2 - 3 weeks. Notebooks will be graded on the following expectations:

- Work is complete, organized and right and left sides are correct
- All entries use dates and titles (see example on board and in website)
- Cover pages are decorated and demonstrate the theme of the unit
- Page numbers are correct and match up to the table of contents
- Use of color, illustrations and appropriate visual graphic organizers
- Use of highlighting to aid in presentation and organization
- OBVIOUS PRIDE IN WORK QUALITY!**

Remember, the notebook forms the most substantial part of your grade; therefore, it is imperative that you regularly check the above list and www.edline.net to make sure your notebook has the above elements. See the outlined example below.
